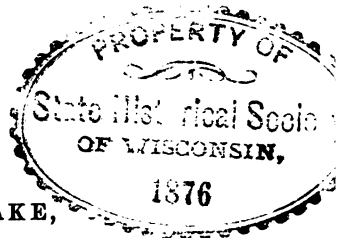

P R E F A C E .

NAMES are appellations, which, when applied to persons, are used to designate one family from another, and one individual from another of the *same* family. Family names are *surnames*, and are arbitrary; depending upon the sole will and choice of the persons taking them. Hence many persons have relinquished their family or surname, and taken some other; while others for the novelty of it, or from some other cause have changed the orthography of their surnames, whereby the number of names has not only been greatly increased, but a knowledge of the ancestry of some families entirely lost.

While the right of a person to assume a new name is conceded, there is also high authority for saying, that every man has a right to *spell* his *own* name as he pleases, *but not that of another*.

To surnames are prefixed other and various names to designate individuals, the offspring of the same paternity — such are called *christian names*.

The orthography of both christian and surnames in the following pages will be thought, in some instances by most readers, to be incorrect, and, perhaps in some, *known* to be so by those to whom they are applied. However that may be, I have followed the orthography, as also the dates without regard to old and new style, as found in public records and in the communications sent me; preferring, in a few instances excepted, where the orthography was manifestly erroneous, to take it as I found it.

An article upon the origin of names, and one upon old and new style may be found at the close of the volume.

EXPLANATIONS.

THE figures in the first left hand column denote the number of each individual in the whole number traced. Those in the second, the num-

ber of children in the family. Those in the right hand column that the person against whose name they are placed had or has descendants or is further noticed — such may be found with his or her family by corresponding figures on the left hand against his name or that of her husband in the succeeding generation. Those in brackets following the name of the husband or wife refer to his or her number in the whole number traced and to his or her number in the family to which he or she belonged. Towns, when mentioned are to be understood as in Massachusetts, unless otherwise designated or implied. Places of residence, when known, are also mentioned. It is matter of regret that so many omissions in that particular are found in the documents sent me. A knowledge of one's residence, who had a family, is not only desirable but essentially necessary to aid the enquirer where to look for his descendants or a record of them — without it he is not unlike a ship in the midst of a broad and trackless ocean seeking her destined port without chart or compass.

INTRODUCTION.

A desire to know my ancestors, paternal and maternal, in a continuous line to the period of their first settling in this country, gave rise to this publication.

While accomplishing it, collaterals and their descendants met me on every side, and claimed of me that notice, which had been so long neglected — THAT THE KNOWLEDGE OF THEM MIGHT NOT DIE WITH THEM. That appeal was not made in vain — it has been complied with, and the result is here embodied in a record of the Ward family, not only in discharge of a duty to the DEPARTED, but for the information of their descendants now on the stage, and of those that are yet to come.

It embraces the names of all the descendants of William Ward, so far as they have come to my knowledge from county, town, parish and family records. Further time and researches would no doubt lead to the discovery of others, and to what became of some herein mentioned, of whom but little is known.

The first mention of William Ward, and of his being in America, that I have been able to find, was in 1639. In that year, according to the records of Sudbury, the proprietors of that plantation made three divisions of their lands; the first in 1639, the second and third, in 1640 — it appears of record, that William Ward shared in each of these divisions; then having a second wife and several children. Tradition, transmitted from his early descendants, says he came from Yorkshire or Derbyshire in England. Investigations have recently been made in England to ascertain his paternity, but without any satisfactory result. They are still being made for that purpose, and to learn the names of his wives and births of his children, who came here with him. Yet, as considerable time may elapse before the final result can be obtained, and, when obtained, may not be conclusive, it is deemed not advisable to delay this publication for information from abroad to the disappointment at home, of many of his descendants, who are impatient by reason of their ad-

vanced age, to be informed of their ancestry, at least in America, before they go hence.

Information already received, renders it improbable that he came from Yorkshire, although it is quite certain, that his early ancestors were of that place. Seven hundred and ten distinguished persons, each bearing but one name, accompanied William, the Conqueror, from Normandy to the conquest of England in 1066 ; a record of all of whose names is yet preserved. Among the number, was "Ward, one of the noble Captains." This is the earliest period in which the name is found in English history, and the first which appears there with an additional name was William de la Ward, residing in Chester, in 1175.

From 1349, a succession of eleven generations of one family is found there, in each of which, the name of the head of the family was, in the first, *Ralph* ; in the second, *Richard* ; in the third, *John* ; in the fourth, *John* ; in the fifth, *Richard* ; in the sixth, *William* ; in the seventh, *Thomas* ; in the eighth, *Thomas* ; in the ninth, *John* ; in the tenth, *Richard* ; and in the eleventh, *Thomas*, who had sons *John* and *William* — these were prevailing names in the early families descended from William of Sudbury, and are yet retained to a considerable extent in the families of his descendants to the present time.

The Wards of Yorkshire spread into the adjoining counties of England ; those of Durham, whence it may be, came William Ward, afterwards of Sudbury, were descendants of the Yorkshire Wards — the arms anciently belonging to the family here, were Azure, a cross baton, or Crest, wolfs head erased — and such were those of the Durham Wards.

William Ward was made freeman in 1643 ; represented Sudbury in the General Court in 1644, and was several years Chairman of the selectmen, as he was in 1660, when he removed from that town.

He, with twelve others belonging to Sudbury, petitioned the General Court in 1656 for a new plantation of eight miles square, saying, "Whereas, your petitioners have lived divers years in Sudbury, and God hath been pleased to increase our children, which are now, divers of them, grown to man's estate, and wee many of us grown into years so as that wee should bee glad to see them settled before the Lord take us away from hence, as also God having given us some considerable quantity of cattle, so that wee are so straightened that wee cannot so comfortably subsist as could be desired ; and some of us having taken some pains to view the country, wee have found a place which lieth Westward about eight miles from Sudbury which wee conceive might bee comfortable for our subsistence," &c.

Sudbury then contained less than seventy-five families, and embraced in territory what is now Sudbury and Wayland — one would naturally think they were “straightened” for *neighbors*, more than for want of room; and so they found it, even twenty years later, when the town with an increased population was nearly destroyed by the Indians.

Their petition was granted to the extent of “six miles square, or otherwise, in some convenient form equivalent thereto in the place desired” — the plantation was laid out not six miles *square*, yet, for an “equivalent thereto,” it was, to say the least of it, a very liberal admeasurement; embracing in territory most of what is now comprised in the towns of Marlborough, Westborough, Northborough, and Southborough — the names of the three last mentioned towns are significant of their relative location to the towns from which they were set off — Westborough, including what is Northborough, was set off from Marlborough in 1717 — Northborough from Westborough in 1766, and Southborough from Marlborough in 1727. The plantation was incorporated by the name of Marlborough in 1660; in that year William Ward removed there from Sudbury, and was chosen deacon of the church when first organized there — the house lots ranged from fifteen to fifty acres each, and each was entitled to a proportionate share in the after divisions of the common lands — his was a fifty acre lot, situated on the South side of the road and nearly opposite the site of the first Meeting house, which was not far from where the Gates Academy now stands — he built and resided upon it — his lands by after divisions extended Westward to what, in some of his conveyances, he called “Belcher’s Pond,” near which was erected the public house, long and wide known, as the *Williams Tavern*, and kept by Abraham Williams, who married the eldest daughter of William Ward, and afterwards by his grand son, Col. Abraham Williams, and subsequently by Silas Gates, who married into that family.

William Ward, in common with others, endured great hardships and sustained great losses by Indian hostilities; more especially in the time of King Phillip’s war in 1675–6, when his buildings were fired, his cattle destroyed, and one of his sons slain by the enemy.

He died at Marlborough, Aug. 10, 1687; the record there does not state his age — a knowledge of which would greatly facilitate the discovery of his parentage by identifying him from some others of the name of William, who, as appears by records from England, were born within a few years of each other — his age is supposed to have been eighty five or ninety; probably it was the latter. His Will bears date “the

sixth of April, in the year of our Lord Christ, one thousand six hundred and eighty-six ;" wherein he says, "enjoying through God's mercy the entireness of my understanding ; but by reason of my great age and the infirmities thereof, being sensible of approaching death, do make this my last will," &c. — appoints his "loving wife, Elizabeth, sole executrix ;" gives liberally to her, and requests his "sons, John Ward, Increase Ward, and son-in-law, Abraham Williams, to be helpful to his wife, as occasion may require ; — gives "to all my own children, viz. all my sons and daughters, which I have by my former wife, and all that I have surviving by my present wife." He also gave legacies to his grand children and to their mothers, children and widows of his "sons, Richard and Eleazer, deceased." He had fourteen children ; and as he gave to *all* the children by his former wife, and to the *surviving* by his then wife, it is presumed all of them by the first wife were living at the date of his Will ; and that Richard, his fourth child, who died in 1666, at the age of thirty-one years, was by his last wife — hence he must have married a second time, some years before he left England.

His widow, when past her seventy-fourth year, made several journies to Boston, as appears by the Probate records there, before she effected a settlement of his estate with the exorbitant and tyrannical Andros, Governor, Judge of Probate, &c. Considering the distance she resided from Boston, exceeding thirty miles, much of the way a wilderness frequented by lurking savages, a bridle way her road, and on which one of her sons had been a few years before shot down by the enemy at noon day, she must have been a person of great fortitude, and possessed of physical powers in an eminent degree.

She died at Marlborough, where, some years since, her grave stone was standing, on which was an inscription as follows :

"Here lyes the body of Elizabeth Ward, the servant of the Lord — deceased in 87 year of her age, Dec. ye 9, in the year of our Lord 1700."

- (2) II. JOHN WARD, [2.1] freeman, 1649, proprietor of Sudbury, 1651, m. Hannah, b. Eng., 1651, dau. of Mr. Edward Jackson, of Cambridge, that part now Newton, about 1650, where he settled, and was Selectman nine years, and nine years Representative (not sixteen as said by Farmer) in "The Great and General Court;" he lived in the Southeasterly part of the town — his dwelling house was constructed for, and used as a garrison prior to, and at the time of King Philip's war, 1675-6. In 1701 he disposed of his real estate, lying mostly in one body, by deeds of gift to his sons. The quantity of land to each was about one hundred acres, and in each deed was a clause restricting the grantee from selling without the consent of his brothers, or the major part of them. When any one

of them sold, his brothers witnessed the deed, and thereby gave their implied consent to the sale. He made his will, Feb. 2, 1708, and d. at Newton, July 8, 1708, aged 82, and his wife Hannah, April 24, 1704, aged 73. *g. stones.* They had

(3) II. ABRAHAM WILLIAMS, freeman, 1652, m. Joanna Ward, [3.2] and settled at Marlboro', near "Belcher's Pond"—where has long been a public house, and, many years ago, known as the "William's Tavern"—her father in his will and certain deeds speaks of Abraham Williams as his son-in law, and calls the pond, lying near his house, Belcher's Pond; Abraham Williams represented Marlboro' in the General Court, and d. there Dec. 29, 1712, and his wid., Joanna, Dec. 8, 1718, aged 90. T. Rec. Marlboro' records are very imperfect with respect to their chil. — the names of no other than Lydia and John are found there; and the birth of the latter is not on record. They had at least four chil., viz:

were living, Dec. 18, 1711, as appears by their father's deed of gift, recorded with Middlesex deeds, at Cambridge. Abraham Williams disposed of his estate by deed of gift, dated Dec. 28, 1712, — recorded with Middlesex deeds, Book 16, page 82, from which the following are extracts :

To all people &c : — Know ye that I, Abraham Williams, sen. of the town of Marlboro' &c., being stricken in years, and not knowing how soon my Lord will call, upon good considerations me moving, do give and grant as followeth : after my decease and the decease of my beloved consort, Joanna Williams, there shall be paid out of my estate, to my daughter, Elizabeth Beman, besides what she hath already had, three score pounds in New England money — unclipt money — it shall be for her and her children forever ; also I give to her and hers half my stock that shall then be found, except one *yoak* of oxen and feeding cattle, and one horse. The one-half of all the rest shall be theirs free forever. I also give to my daughter, Elizabeth Beman, and to hers half of my household goods, and to my son-in-law, Thomas Beman, thirty pounds passable money, and forty acres of land I bought of my brother, John Ward, [he was of Newton] and twenty six acres that lies adjoining it — in all three score and six acres : it shall be his forever after our decease, to stand good in fee simple. And because God hath taken away my eldest son and proper heir, and who never had any possession of my housing or lands, but as we traded together with corn and cattle, and so he had his part of all our income, and having left with me one only son, I reckon him my proper heir in his father's room ; and accordingly do give and grant to him, as first born, viz : Abraham Williams, together with his uncle, John Williams, all the rest of my estate undisposed of, viz : all my housing, with the land they stand upon and is about them on every side bounded and fenced, and all my lands and meadows abroad ; all my husbandry furniture, carpentering tools, and the rest of my stock — they shall be Abraham Williams his and John Williams his together, not to be parted, but improved for their subsistence together, unless extremity enforces a sale of a small piece thereof — all these gifts and grants shall be to them and their heirs forever. And further, concerning William Ripley, whom we have brought up from a child ; his time

is not long to stay on strict terms—then nine pounds will be due him, one he hath had already—let his due be paid out of the whole estate—if he will stay with Abraham and John for reasonable wages by the year, three or four years, then I give to him, for his own forever, to settle on, twenty acres of land at Rock patch, with the meadow to it, next to my son Beman's. If he like not that, he shall have twenty acres at the west end of Crane hill, and three acres of meadow at Cedar meadow above the Island next to Barns. And if not that, he must go.

I desire and pray, my three beloved friends, my son-in-law, Thomas Beman, my brother, Samuel Ward, and my cousin, Joseph Stratton, to be overseers and feofees in trust, to see to the fulfilling of these gifts and improvement of the other according to the premises for my wife, John and Abraham. And when God shall take either of us away, to allow a decent and Christian burial, without weeds or flourishes, for our fathers and mothers had none.

Signed with my own hand and sealed with my own seal, &c. Dec. 18, 1711.

- (4) II. "OBADIAH WARD, [4.3] and Mary his wife, were m., Nov. 13, 1669;" so is the record. In the early settlement of the country, the like record of marriages was not uncommon, whereby the family name of the wife is not only withheld, but the record so made as to imply a wife before marriage. Their marriage took place probably in 1667, instead of '69. He had lands assigned him in Sudbury, in 1653, and a house lot of twenty-one acres, with after divisions in Marlboro' in 1660, and moved there soon after; where his wife Mary d., Aug. 22, 1706. [He next m., when past the age of 74, Joanna, b. Dec. 14, 1666, dau. of Isaac Mixer, of Watertown, who survived him.] He was Rep. from Marlboro', in 1689, and d. there, Jan. 5, 1718, aged 86. She was not 21 years old at the time of her first husband's death, by whom she had Hannah, b. 1671, and Mary, posthumous, 1677. The latter was the wife of Maj. John Keyes, whose houses, and in them his sons, Solomon, 20; John, 10; and Stephen 6 years of age, were burned in the night time, Aug., 1723. Maj. Keyes d. at Shrewsbury, March 31, 1768, aged 93 years 7 months; and his wid., Mary, April 16, 1772, aged 95 years and 1 month. They lived together in the married state upwards of seventy-two years.

In the history of Rehoboth, by Leonard Bliss, jr., it is said, "The Rev. Thomas Greenwood d. Sept. 8, 1720, at half-past two, P. M., aged 50 years. He was a native of Weymouth, Mass., where his father, of whose Christian name I am ignorant, died, according to minutes made by Rev. Thomas Greenwood, Sept. 1, 1693, in the evening." This account agrees with the time of the death of Thomas Greenwood, of Newton, as inscribed on his grave-stone, still standing in the ancient burying-ground in Newton. The town records of Weymouth do not contain the name of any

one of his family, nor is his name found there. Yet, his son, Thomas, *may* have been b. there. The birth of Thomas, son of Thomas and Hannah Greenwood, is found in Middlesex records, Jan. 27, 1673 — the figure 3 having been substituted for some other one erased. Thomas, father of Rev. Thomas Greenwood, was Selectman in Newton, (then Cambridge,) 1686-7-90, and d. in that office, Sept. 1, 1693. The Rev. Thomas would have been almost 50 when he d., if b. Artemas Ward resided at Shrewsbury, but did not

study a profession. At the age of 25 years, he was commissioned a Justice of the Peace ; in 1755, a Major in the 3d Regiment of Militia in the counties of Middlesex and Worcester, whereof Abraham Williams, Esquire, of Marlboro', was Col. ; and, in 1758, was Major in the Regt. of foot commanded by William Williams, raised for a general invasion of Canada. He went out on that ill-fated expedition under the command of Gen. Abercrombie, from which he returned with the rank of Lt. Col. The frequent wars between England and France involved the American Colonies in the contests of the mother country until the conquest of Canada in 1760. Our northern frontier was long the principal battle-ground, where the Provincials, coöperating with regular and well disciplined troops under the command of experienced officers, were at school in learning the art of war, and therein made such proficiency, that in a short time they coped with their teachers, and, possessing an unconquerable spirit and love of liberty, turned them out of the school-house and retained possession for themselves and their posterity — forever may they keep it !

Artemas Ward succeeded Abraham Williams in the command of the 3d Regiment, and represented his native town in the Gen. Court ; where he took an active part in the controversies between the Colonial Governors and the House of Reps. that preceded the Revolution.

Fearless in speech and resolute in manner, he boldly denounced such Parliamentary measures as encroached on the rights of the Colonies, and which the Governors, if they did not recommend, at least sought to enforce in offensive language and by arbitrary means. The country was roused, and militia trainings became frequent ; some of whose officers gave political as well as military instruction to the troops under their command ; such was Col. Ward's practice, which occasioned the following letter : —

BOSTON, June 30, 1766.

To Artemas Ward, Esquire. Sir : I am ordered by the Governor to signify to you, that he has thought fit to supersede your commission of Col. in the Regt. of Militia lying in part in the County of Worcester, and partly in the County of Middlesex. And your said commission is superseded accordingly.

I am, sir, your most obt. and humble servt.,

JOHN COTTON, Dep'ty Sec'y.

The foregoing letter was forwarded by Express, and the messenger, as directed, delivered it himself to Col. Ward, and then waited until he had opened and read it, as if to ascertain and report how it was received. As the messenger was in full military costume and mounted on a foaming steed, he attracted the attention of many citizens, who were present, and who enquired of Col. Ward, if he had important news — whereupon he read the letter aloud, and then, turning to the messenger, said, give my compliments to the Governor, and say to him, I consider myself *twice* honored, but more in being superseded, than in having been commissioned, and that I thank him for this, holding up the letter, since the motive that dictated it is evidence, that *I am*, what *he is not*, a *friend to my country*.

In losing the confidence of the Governor he shared more largely in that of the public. In 1768, the House of Reps. being disposed to surround the Governor with a Council composed of men proved and approved for their patriotism and fidelity, elected him as one of the members of that body. The Governor negatived the choice — some others shared the same fate. What a compliment to their integrity and vigilance in defending chartered rights! The people sustained their Representatives, and for so doing, were threatened with subjection by military force. The country was alarmed. Submission or resistance was the only alternative. Conventions were held, and through them the people, as with one voice, proclaimed resistance and their determination to repel force by force; preparations for that purpose commenced; and on the 27th of October, 1774, the Provincial Congress, then sitting at Cambridge, elected Jedediah Preble, Artemas Ward, and Seth Pomroy, General Officers, to take rank in the order above stated. Hostilities commenced at Lexington and Concord on the 19th of April, 1775, and, on the 20th, Gen. Ward was at Cambridge; where on that day he issued several general orders, and appointed Samuel Osgood, Esq., afterwards of Andover, and Joseph Ward, Esq., of Newton, his Aids-de-Camp; the latter also officiated as his Secretary. Mr. Preble did not accept his appointment. It was not until the 19th of May following, that Gen. Ward was appointed Commander-in-chief. On the 20th he received his commission, which was as follows:—

The Congress of the Colony of the Massachusetts Bay.
To the Honourable ARTEMAS WARD, Esquire,
Greeting: —

We, reposing especial trust and confidence in your courage and good conduct, do by these presents constitute and appoint you, the said ARTEMAS WARD, to be GENERAL and COMMANDER IN CHIEF of all the forces raised by the Congress aforesaid, for the defence of this and the other American Colonies.

You are therefore carefully and diligently to discharge the duty of a GENERAL in leading, ordering, and exercising the FORCES in Arms, both inferior officers and soldiers, and to keep them in good order and discipline; and they are hereby commanded to obey you as their GENERAL; and you are yourself to observe and follow such orders and instructions as you shall, from time to time, receive from this or any future Congress or House of Representatives of this Colony, or the Committee of Safety, so far as said Committee is empowered by their commission to order and instruct you for the defence of this and the other Colonies, and to demean yourself according to the military rules and discipline established by said Congress in pursuance of the trust reposed in you.

Dated 19th May A. D. 1775.

Middlesex, ss. May 20, 1775.

The Honorable Artemas Ward, Esquire, took the oath appointed by the Congress of the Colony of the Massachusetts Bay to be taken by the General Officers and subscribed the same before me.

SAMUEL DEXTER, Justice of the Peace.

This commission did not authorize him to command the forces raised in the other Colonies, of which a considerable number arrived at Cambridge previous to the battle of Bunker Hill.

A continental Congress assembled at Philadelphia in Sept., 1774, and on the 15th day of June, 1775, made choice, unanimously, of GEORGE WASHINGTON, to command all the Continental Forces raised or to be raised for the defence of American Liberty — and on the 17th, Artemas Ward, Esquire, was chosen first Maj. General, and Charles Lee, Esquire, second Maj. General.

In April, 1776, Gen. Ward represented to Congress the feeble state of his health and his unwillingness to continue in office and receive its emoluments, while prevented by ill health from rendering an equivalent in the service, and requested Congress to accept his resignation of the office of Maj. General. He continued in the service at the request of Gen. Washington and of the Continental Congress until the close of that year. In 1777 he was elected by the House of Reps. a member of the Executive Council of the State of Massachusetts, and by the Council, President of that Board; and in 1779, appointed a member of the Continental Congress, but prevented by ill health from taking a seat in that body.

After the adoption of the Federal Constitution, he was elected and re-elected a member of Congress.

A monument in the burying-ground at Shrewsbury erected to his memory has the following inscription, containing a condensed account of the principal stations in which he acted his part in an eventful period of our country's history:—

Major General Artemas Ward,
son of Col. Nahum Ward,

H. U. 1748; 1762 a Justice, and 1776, Chief Justice of the
C. C. Pleas for the County of Worcester.

1758 a Major in the expedition against Canada.

1759 appointed Col.; 1766 his commission, as Col., revoked
for his inflexible opposition to arbitrary power;

that he had been *twice* honored.

and deprived of a seat at that Board.

Firmness of mind and integrity of purpose were characteristic of
his whole life — so that he was never swayed by the applause or
censure of man, but ever acted under a deep sense of duty to his
country and accountability to his God.

Long will his memory be precious among the friends of
Liberty and Religion.

He was afterwards appointed Muster-master General by Gen. Washington, taken prisoner at Long Island, in the latter part of the year 1778,

and exchanged in April, 1779; for the procurement of which the Executive Council of Massachusetts had warmly interceded. In a letter of grateful acknowledgments to that body for this distinguished favor, he says: "It is a new incitement to exertions in the cause of freedom; and may that hour alone, which closes my life, terminate my efforts for the happiness of my country." He rejoined the army and continued in the service until Feb., 1780; when he returned and settled in Boston, where he m. Prudence, Nov. 30, 1784, daughter of Jacob Bird, of Dorchester, and b. Feb. 28, 1765. Some years after he removed to Newton, his native town, which he represented in the Gen. Court. In 1804, he returned with his family to Boston, and d. there Feb. 14, 1812, aged 75. Extract from an obituary notice of the death of Col. Ward, published in the Columbian Centinel, Boston, Feb. 22, 1812:—

"In tracing the actions of the amiable patriot who has now closed his virtuous career, we behold him, at the commencement of hostilities in 1775, animating his fellow-countrymen by his example and his counsels — portraying the dangers that were about to assail them, and exhibiting the firmness with which such dangers should be met. He stood among the first to unsheath his sword, and defend the violated rights of his country. Distinguished by sentiments elevated and patriotic as these, he was selected as the Aid-de-Camp of the Commander in Chief. He afterwards received the appointment of

Muster-master General, with the rank of Colonel. In 1780, this office was associated with that of Inspector General of Discipline. Col. Ward acquiesced with satisfaction in this arrangement, and received in a style, equally flattering to his character and his conduct, the approbation of Gen. Washington for the exemplary manner in which he had discharged the duties of his office. With dignity he retired from the army, possessed of the affection and esteem of his brother officers and soldiers. His talents adorned, and his virtues were the charm of private life. The influence of religion over his mind, was equally conspicuous, whether warmed by the genial sun of prosperity, or chilled by the winter blasts of adversity. In public transactions, Justice was the pole star, and truth the guide of his conduct.

Firmly relying on this foundation, he considered, that he rested on that which would never fail; with confidence he vested his fortune in evidences of property guaranteed by the public engagements of his country, and in titles to land granted and sanctioned by the faith of the Legislature of a State. To the last moment of his life, he advocated his claims with a clearness of conception, and a strength of argument, the truth of which must ever be felt and admired. Although he is dead, the principles of justice and good faith still live; and that the widow and the orphan may yet feel their influence, is the prayer of a sincere friend to suffering virtue." It may be here remarked, that ever since his death, *justice has been in a profound sleep.*

In the meantime, his wife, with her helpless children, unprotected and exposed to the ravages of the British soldiery and their savage allies, then within a few miles of her dwelling, fled to Bennington, forty miles through a wilderness, on foot, with her children, carrying the youngest in her arms, and without a man to protect them, or guide, except blazed trees, to direct her way. They reached there in safety, and quickly followed the battle at Bennington and the surrender of Burgoyne.

The family returned to Poultney, where he continued to reside until his death, Aug. 3, 1819. His wid., Lucy, d. at Poultney, Jan. 6, 1846, at the age of 98 years. The following is an extract from an obituary notice of him, published in a Vermont newspaper, a few days after his death:—

“Died, at his residence in Poultney, on the 3d inst., (Aug., 1819,) the Hon. William Ward, aged 76. He was one of the first settlers of the town, and during the Revolutionary war took an active and zealous part in his country's defence. He was a member of the Convention which framed the Constitution of the State. He was six years one of the Judges of the County Court, for the County of Rutland, and twenty-two years Judge of Probate, for the District of Fairhaven.

He served forty years as a Justice of the Peace, and represented the town in the State Legislature eighteen

years. He made a public profession of religion more than fifty years, and served as a Deacon of a church nearly forty years. His health was always remarkably good—he was never confined to his bed an hour by sickness; never had a bone broken or dislocated—never took an emetic, nor a cathartic. He was never bled, nor did he ever lose a meal of victuals, 'till the Friday before his death."

"It ought to be remarked, that, as a neighbor, he was universally beloved; as a citizen, he was highly esteemed and respected; and, as a Christian, venerated. No one said ought against him; he always performed the various duties assigned him, whether public or private, civil or religious, with perfect fidelity and integrity." His chil. were,

INDIVIDUAL AND FAMILY NAMES.

"WHAT'S IN A NAME?"

Imago animi, vultus; vitas, Nomen est. — Puteanus.

Individual Names, or Names of Individuals, were given for the distinction of persons, one from another, as Adam, Eve, Noah, Abraham, Sarah, Paul and John. Such names have always been in use, and, at the present day, are generally termed christian or baptismal names. They were adopted originally, to a great extent, from the consideration of their signification. As an illustration of this remark, we present the following names:—First, of men; namely, Adam—earthy, taken out of the earth; Abel—just; Alexander—helper of men; Andrew—manful; Benjamin—son of the right hand; Caleb—heartly; Chrysostom—golden mouth; Constantine—firm; Daniel—judgment of God; David—beloved; Edmund—happy; Edwin—happy victor; Edward—happy keeper; Ellis, (corruptly for Elias)—Lord God; Erasmus—amiable; Francis—free; Frederic—rich peace; Gabriel—man of God; George—husbandman; Godfrey—God's peace; Goodrich—rich in God; Hector—defender; Humphrey—house peace; Hierome—holy name; Isaac—laughter; Israel—prevailing in the Lord; John—gracious; Joseph—increase of the Lord; Leonard—lion-hearted; Luke—luminous; Matthew—reward; Moses—drawn forth; Nathaniel—the gift of God; Neale—blackish; Nicholas—conqueror; Oswald—Steward; Paul—wonderful; Phillippe—lover of horses; Robert—famous in counsel; Roger—quiet; Reuben—vision of the sun; Seaborn—born upon the sea; Sebastian—majestic; Sylvanus—woodman; Stephen—a crown; Theophilus—lover of God; Thomas—a twin; Vincent—victorious; William—a defence of many; Wilfred—much peace; Zachariah—the memory of the Lord:—Secondly, of women: namely, Abigail—the father's joy; Alice—noble; Adeline—descending from nobles; Barbara—strange; Catharine—chaste; Clara—bright; Dorcas—a roebuck; Eleanor—pitiful; Eve—giving life; Florence—flourishing; Joanna—grace of the Lord; Judith—praising; Lucia—lightsome; Mary—exalted; Margaret—precious; Priscilla—ancient; Rosamund—rose of the world; Susanna—lily; Sophia—wisdom; Theodosia—God's gift; Ursula—little bear. Thus, chris-

tian names were originally given as expressive of some circumstance of birth, personal quality possessed, good desired by parents, or some other reason. Much importance was attached to the name as indicating the fortune of the child. Hence the proverb, "*Bonum nomen, bonum omen.*"

Family names were given for the purpose of particularizing families. They are a sort of hereditary distinction, and are called by the French and English, surnames, because added to christian or baptismal names. In the early state of society among the Jews, Egyptians, Persians, Greeks, Romans, Germans, Gauls, Britons, indeed among every nation, no individual had more than one name; but in a more advanced or refined period, an additional name was given, in order to mark the different families to which individuals belonged, as well as to distinguish members of the same family from each other. Among the Greeks a few families at Athens and Sparta had family names. When the league was established between the Romans and the Sabines, to confirm which it was covenanted that the Romans should add Sabine names to theirs, and that the Sabines should add Roman names to theirs. These were termed *nomina Gentilitia, et cognomina*, as their previous names were termed *prænomena*. Commonly among the Romans, each person had three names; namely, a proper name (*prænomen*, which distinguished the individual,) the name of the clan, (*nomen*,) and the family name, (*cognomen*.) Sometimes also a surname was added, which was given on account of some distinguished exploit or remarkable event. The *prænomen* was placed first, and usually written with one or two letters; as *M.* for *Marcus*, *Q.* for *Quintus*, *Cn.* for *Cneius*. Then followed the *nomen*; as *Fabius*, *Julius*, (from the clan (*gens*,) Fabian, Julian.) Lastly came the *cognomen*; as *Cicero*, *Scipio*. In the name *M. Tullius Cicero*, *M.* is the *prænomen*, which distinguishes him from his brother *Quintus*; *Tullius*, the *nomen*, which distinguishes the clan, (*gens*;) and *Cicero*, the *cognomen*, which shows his family. An instance of a surname, (*agnomen*,) is *Africanus*, added to *Scipio*; as *Publius Cornelius Scipio Africanus*.

The Hebrews in their genealogies, instead of surnames, used the name of the father with *Ben*, which signifies son, as Melchi, Ben Addi; Addi, Ben Cosam; Cosam, Ben Elmadam; — that is, Melchi, son of Addi; Addi, son of Cosam; Cosam, son of Elmadam. A similar practice prevailed among our English ancestors, as Ceonred Ceolwaling, Ceolwald Cuthing, Cuth, Cuthwinning; — that is, Ceonred, son of Ceolwald, Ceolwald, son of Cuth, Cuth, son of Cuthwin, the termination or suffix, *ing*, meaning son or offspring. In the same sense, the Welsh Britons used *Ap*, (son,) as Ap Owen;

Owen, Ap Harry; Harry, Ap Rhese; — that is, son of Owen; Owen, son of Harry; Harry, son of Rhese. The same may be said with regard to the Scotch in the use of Mac, (son,) as Donald, Mac Wharter; Wharter, Mac Dowell; Dowell, Mac Clelland; — that is, Donald, son of Wharter; Wharter, son of Dowell; Dowell, son of Clelland. With the Irish, the expression for son is Oy or O'; as O'Neal; Neal, O'Riley; Riley, O'Brien; Brien, O'Connell; Connell, O'Harra; — that is, son of Neal; Neal, son of Riley; Riley, son of Brien; Brien, son of Connell; Connell, son of Hara. In like manner, the old Normans in their surnames used Fitz, a corruption for Fitz, (son,) as John, Fitz Robert; Robert, Fitz William; William, Fitz Hugh; Hugh, Fitz Gerald; Gerald, Fitz Herbert; Herbert, Fitz Roy.

Surnames began to be used by the French nation about the commencement of the eleventh century,* and by the English nation about the time of Willam, the Conqueror, in 1066, when the Conquest was achieved, or, as some suppose, as early as Edward, the Confessor, who began his reign in 1041. It is certain that the occasional use of surnames in England dates beyond the ingress of the Normans. But before the Conquest it was usual for persons to subscribe to deeds and all legal instruments, with a cross and a single name, without a surname, in the following manner: + Ego Eadredus confirmani; + Ego Edmundus corroborani; + Ego Sigarius conclusi. In the authentic record of the Exchequer in England, called the Domesday Book, surnames are first found in public records in established order. The Scotch date the use of surnames about the time the English do; but it is not certain that they are correct in doing it. In England these names were introduced gradually. They were first assumed by the people of the "better sort," generally, who took the names of their estates, and it was not until the reign of Edward II., (1307,) that they were "settled among the common people fully." In Germany and some kindred nations, family names were little used by the commoners before the fourteenth century. The most current opinion is, that surnames can scarcely be said to have been permanently settled before the era of the Reformation, in the sixteenth century.†

The origin of surnames is various. The greatest number, probably, are derived from towns, villages, seats or patrimonial possessions. The most ancient, says the learned Camden, are from places in Normandy, and countries adjoining it. All names having the French *De, Du, Des, De la* prefixed, or beginning or ending

with Font, Fant, Beau, Saint, Mont, Bois, Aux, are of this description. The names of Warren, Mortimer, Percy, Devereaux, Harcourt, Tracy, Montfort, and Cayly are derived from places in Normandy. Indeed, there is scarcely a village in that country which has not given a name to some family in England. From places in France are derived the names of Courtney, Bollein, Paris, Corby, Bohun, Saint George, Saint Andrew, Cressy, Lyons, Loring,* and Beaumont. Nearly all the towns, villages and hamlets, also, in England and Scotland, have given names to families, as Murray, Clifford, Stafford, Gordon, Douglass, Heydon, Barkeley, Leigh, Hastings, Hamleton, Booths, Clinton, Cotton, Hume, Stanhope, Sydenham, Arlington, Whitney, Wentworth, Fanshaw, Carie, Hartshorne, Gifford, Bassett, Howard, Talbot, Lovell, Tirell, Blunt, and Bissett. Most of the families in Cornwall have names, a constituent part of which is contained in the following distich :

“ By Tre, Ros, Pol, Lan, Caer and Pen,†
You may know the most Cornish men.”

All names, which in England had *Of* set before them, which in Cheshire and the North was contracted into *A*, as Thomas, a Dutton, John a Standish, Adam a Kirby, or which in Latin had *De* prefixed, were derived from places. The same may be said, to a considerable extent, of those names which had *Le* before them. Under the head of local names may be placed also such as Hill, Wood, Field, Pool, Pond.

Next to local names or those derived from places, the most numerous are those derived from trades or professions, as Archer, Brewer, Brazier, Baker, Carpenter, Goldsmith, Cutter, Fisher, Taylor, Potter, Smith, Saddler, Painter, Webster, Wheeler, Wright, Wheelwright, Mason, Gardner, Turner.

Some names have been assumed from office, as Chamberlain, Cooke, Marshall, Sergeant, Foster, Fowler, Page, Butler, Clarke, Proctor, Abbot, Bishop, Priest, Dean.

Names have been taken from titles of honor, dignity, or estate, as King, Prince, Lord, Baron, Knight, Squire.

Names also have been derived from bodily or mental qualities, as Goodman, Wise, Proud, Strong, Armstrong, Long, Low, Short, Little.

Periods of life have given rise to names, as Old, Young, Child, Baby.

* The name of Loring, though not found in the Roll of Battel Abbey, by Fox, is found in Leland's copy of the Roll, to which Lower, in his *Essays on English Surnames*, says “The preference ought unquestionably to be conceded.” The name Loring is derived from Lorraine, a province in France.

Some names have been derived from parts of the body, as Head, Whitehead, Legge, Foot, Arm, Heart; and others from the color of complexion or dress, as White, Black, Brown, Green; and others again from fruits and flowers, as Pear, Peach, Lilly, Rose.

Many names are derived from beasts, as Lamb, Lyon, Bear, Buck, Fox, Wolf, Hog, Roe, Badger, Hind, Hare; others from birds, as Dove, Lark, Nightingale, Swallow, Peacock, Sparrow, Swan, Woodcock, Crow, Wren, Parrott; and others from fishes, as Pike, Crab, Bass, Salmon, Haddock.

A considerable number of surnames have originated from christian names, as Francis, Leonard, Herbert, Giles, Lewis, Humphrey, James, Jacob, Daniel, Thomas, Anthony, Alexander.

The names of Corbet, Goodwin, Goodrich, Fabyan, Hervey, Howard, Osburn, Payne, Searle, Star, Swain, Wade, Warner, Hamlin, Talbot, Wade, and Maynard were formerly christian names, and in use about the time of William the Conqueror.

Many surnames are formed by the addition of *son* to a christian name, as Williamson, Robertson, Richardson, Johnson.

Nicknames or nursenames have, in process of time, become family names: as Bill, or Billy, for William; Dick, or Dickey, for Richard.

We might proceed to give other specimens of the origin of names; but our limits will not permit us to enlarge. A sufficient number has been presented to show that it is almost indefinitely various. It is computed that there are between twenty and thirty thousand surnames in England alone. Their origin, too, is often curious. Persons fond of the study of individual or family nomenclature, will be entertained and instructed with the perusal of Camden's *British Remains*, Lower on *English Surnames*, Chambers' and Brande's *Dictionaries*, and the different *Encyclopædias* on this subject, to which we have been greatly indebted in preparing this piece.

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ORIGIN OF THE NAMES OF THE DAYS OF THE WEEK, AND
OF THE NAMES OF THE MONTHS.

SUNDAY, the first day of the week, now generally termed Sabbath day, was called *Sun's* day, being a day anciently dedicated to the *Sun*.

MONDAY, a compound word of *Moon* and *day*; a day formerly sacred to that planet.

TUESDAY, is from *Tuesdaeg*, the name of a deity, that presided over combats and litigation; hence Tuesday is Court day, assize day, the day for combat or commencing litigation.

WEDNESDAY, anciently *Wodin's* day, from *Wodin*, a deity among the northern nations of Europe.

THURSDAY, from *Thor's* day; the day consecrated to *Thor*, the god of thunder.

FRIDAY, from *Friga's* day; a day consecrated to *Friga*, the venus of the north.

SATURDAY, from *Saturn's* day; a day devoted to *Saturn*, one of the most ancient of the heathen gods; the reputed son of *Caelus* and *Terra*, (Heaven and Earth,) and father of *Jupiter*.

Instead of these names, the early settlers of New England used the words, first, second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh, to denote the several successive days of the week, and the like words, up to the twelfth, to designate the several months in the year; but, when *writing*, they more frequently made use of Arabic numerals, from 1 to 12, to designate the months; "because they would avoid all memory of heathenish and Idol's names."

At the foundation of Rome, about 750 years before the Christian era, the year consisted of ten months, and of them March was accounted the first month in the year. Two others, January and February, were subsequently added by Numa Pompilius; whereby the year consisted of twelve months, January being the eleventh and February the twelfth and last month in the year; the length of which was established by Julius Caesar, who appointed it to consist of 365 days and 6 hours; which 6 hours made one day in four years; and that day every fourth year, added to the number of days in February, makes that year to consist of 366 days, and is called leap year, on account of its leaping forward one day.

He also placed January at the Winter solstice, followed by February; whereby January became the first month, March, the

third, and December the twelfth and last month in the year. This is called the Julian Calender.

JANUARY is from the Latin, *Januarius*, so called from *Janus*, an ancient Italian King, who was deified after his death. A Temple, and in it a Statue, was erected in honor of him; the latter represented him with *two* faces, looking in opposite directions; upon the *past* and upon the *future*, January being the boundary month between successive years, the one face was towards the retiring, the other towards the coming year. Hence the expression "*Janus-faced*," now used as a term of reproach.

FEBRUARY is from the Latin, *Februo*, to purify by sacrifice, and thus signified the month of purification.

MARCH, from the Latin, *Martius*, Mars, the god of war.

APRIL, from the Latin, *Aprilis*, opening, open; because in this month all things are, as it were, opened and budded.

MAY, from the goddess *Maia*, wife of *Jupiter* and the mother of *Mercury*; to her sacrifices were offered on the *first* day of the month. At this late period *flowers are sacrificed on that day*, if not to her.

JUNE, from *Juno*, the queen of the goddesses, and patroness of marriage and wedded life.

JULY, from Julius, the surname of CAIUS CAESAR, the Dictator, who was born in this month. MARK ANTONY first gave this month the name of July; previously it was called Quintilis, signifying the fifth month in the year according to the old Roman calender.

AUGUST was so called in honor of the Emperor, OCTAVIUS AUGUSTUS, who entered upon his first consulate in this month; previous to which it was called *Sextilis*, six, the sixth month from March.

SEPTEMBER, from the Latin, *septem*, seven, the seventh month.

OCTOBER, from the Latin, *octo*, eight, the eighth month of the primitive Roman year.

NOVEMBER, from the Latin, *novem*, nine, the ninth month, and

DECEMBER also from the Latin, *decem*, ten, the tenth and last month in the year of the early Romans.]

OLD AND NEW STYLE.

STYLE, in Chronology, is the method of computing time according to the Julian and Gregorian calendar. The former is called old, and the latter, new style.

The Julian calendar, of which we have already spoken, was found to be erroneous, as it contained more than eleven minutes in a year too much. This excess amounted to *ten* days in 1582; in which year Pope Gregory XIII., corrected that calendar, and, to bring the vernal equinox, which happened on the ninth of March in that year, to the twenty-first of that month in future years, and as it occurred in 325, directed that the year 1582 should consist of 365 days only, and that *ten* days be abated between the *fourth* and *fifteenth* of October in that year; and furthermore, to preserve future regularity in the seasons, he ordered that no year ending a century should be leap year, excepting each four hundredth year; whereby *three* days are abated in every four hundred years, three days being nearly equal to eleven minutes for every year in that period.

By each four hundredth year is meant the closing year of that number of centuries, that can be divided by 400 without a remainder. Such are leap years of 366 days; when there is a remainder, they are common years, or years of 365 days. Thus 1600, 2000, and 2400 are leap years while 1700, 1800, and 1900, are common years; and all other years in a century, which can be divided by 4 without a remainder, are also leap years, as 1804, 1808, 1812, &c.

This calendar was soon adopted in most countries, but for a time rejected by our Protestant ancestors, on account of its pagan and popish origin.

At length, by an act of Parliament, in 1751, it was adopted in England, and thereby extended to her colonies.

That Act provided for regulating the commencement of the year, abated eleven days of September, 1751, the *third* to be accounted the *fourteenth*, and the year to commence on the first day of January, 1752.

The difference between old and new style, was, previous to 1700, *ten* days only; but as that year contained only 365 days, by the Gregorian calendar, instead of 366, as by the Julian, it became, *after* 1700, eleven days, and another being lost by the omission of 1 ap year in 1800, the difference now is *twelve* days.

Previous to 1752, two methods of commencing the year prevailed in England; the *Ecclesiastical*, as also the *Legal* year commenced on the *twenty-fifth* of *March*, and the *Historical* year on the *first* of *January*.

This two-fold practice of beginning the year, led to double dating the year, between the first of January and the twenty-fifth of March; as, for instance, 10th of Feb., 1725-6. These figures denote, the 4 first the *Ecclesiastical* and *Legal* year, beginning in March, while the fifth, or suffix 6, denotes the *Historical* year.

These months were frequently written in Arabic numbers, instead of being expressed by their names, and preceded by the number of the days in the month. This practice ceased in 1752, when the year for all purposes was made to begin on the first day of January.

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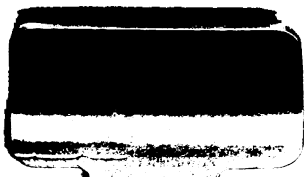


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
