In answer to your letter of

order to obtain the benefits of the act of July
4. 1836 it is indispensable that the marriage
should have taken place before the termination
of the service. You are not therefore entitled
to the benefit of that act, as it appears
from the papers on file that you dec^d hus-
band ^{Jam^s Baggs} left the service in May 1777, and
your letter ^{shows} ~~states~~ that the marriage took
place in November 1780.

Madam:

I have to advise you that the Revolutionary War records of this Bureau fail to afford any information in regard to a James Boggs, but you are herewith furnished the history of James Baggs.

From the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim S. 44346 it appears that James Baggs enlisted in Chester County, Pennsylvania January 22, or 27, 1776 and served as a private in Captain John Reese's Company, Colonel Joseph Wood's Pennsylvania Regiment, was in the battle of Three Rivers and was discharged in May 1777.

He was allowed pension on his application executed November 29, 1819 while living in Brooke County, Virginia (Post Office Wellsburg), at which date he referred to his wife and five children. In 1820 he was aged sixty-seven years and referred to two sons aged

twenty years and thirty-four years, and two daughters aged twenty-four years and twenty-seven years, no names stated. In 1822 he was a resident of Richland County, Ohio. He died February 1, 1827.

Soldier married November 30, 1780, Susannah, born October 4, 1758, her maiden name not stated. She was a resident of Richland County, Ohio in 1837.
