The Delamarter family moved to section 17, Hebron Township, and head in a log house from Cheboygan, May 11,1903, my folks having bought the 160 acre place from John Mann, who bought it in 1902 from the original owner, Charles Romine.

The Rushia family lived in a frame house in the north east quarter of section 21. The Hebron cemetery was a part of this place. The Slack family later lived in this house.

Thomas Tong and his wife lived in a log house near the center of section 21.

William Harger and his son Clyde, lived in a log house near Mud Lake.

Mrs. Shear and her daughter Mary, and her daughter Gladys, lived in a log house in the north west corner of section 21.

Mary later married Jacob Fox, or at least they lived together.

The St. Amour family lived in a log house near Mud Lake, in either section 21 or 28.

There was a log house in section 20, which was vacant in 1903 and later occupied by the George Lucier family. I believe Georges father owned this land and likely built the log house.

William Douglass lived in a small log house in section 20.

Prosper Clement lived in the north east corner of section 20, in a log house

Henry Snyder and family lived in the north west corner of in a log house.

section 20, land the new frame school was built on this property during the fall of 1903. Henry Snyder leased one half acre of land to district No. 5, for 99 years, to be used for the school.

Alexander Page and family bought this land in 1905?

The Bannister family occupied a frame house on the north east corner of section 19.
