Dear Folks;

We were glad to get your letter the other day and to know that you are home and gaining. Hope you will continue.

We have been in contact with Cadwells, over there twice and they stopped here once and told us about getting your letter. We also saw them at church Sunday, Feb. 1, so we have compared letters from you folks. She gave us a few Cheboygan papers. She spoke of some Hielman being in Florida. I think likely it is Karl's son.

We are having the State Journal sent to us here. A few days ago I read that Byron Delamarter had a 12 year record of accident free driving on his mail route. Another had the same and one had 13 years.

The weather has been better here than it was last winter. At least we have had several nice summer days. We had a few days when the wind was coming from the north and it stayed cold all day. Yesterday was one of them.

It rained about all day Monday, Feb. 2, and thru the night and up till about 8 A.M. Tues. Part of the time by bucket fulls. We heard that it measured 6 or 7 inches in Gainesville. For a time it was about 2 inches deep under our trailer. It is sandy here otherwise it might have been deeper. We are near the bottom of a gradually slopping hill and the water finds its way to our trailer. We have had very little rain since we came except that one time. We have had 2 or 3 frosts tho, one time down to 25 or so. It is bright and nice this morning and not as cold as yesterday.

Last Thursday we went to the State Fair at Tampa. Not near as big as our state Fair.

Last Saturday we went to the Michigan picnic at Zephyrhills. We hear that there were 825 there. They are mostly from parks around Zephyrhills. We didn't see any one that we knew in Mich. except a few from our trailer park. We set directly accross from Mr. and Mrs. Wood from Calhoun Co. They had been married 62 years and got the prize for the oldest married couple.

This week Monday we went to Webster to the farmers market. It is combined with sort of an antique sale. They had old fruit jars for sale as high as \$12.00. This one was made in 1896.

On the way back we stopped at a State Park where a battle was fought in 1835 between the Americans and the Indians. This was at Bushnell just a few miles from Webster.

I started this about seven this morning and we went in to town later and just got back a while ago. It is near mail time now, so will get this in the mail. Hope you continue to improve and we will see you in the summer.
