Lastly I give bequeath and devise unto my three sons (jointly) - viz Daniel Andrew and Frederick - All that certain lot piece or parcel of land situate in township number seven in the seventh range of townships in the town of Hunter in the County of Livingston aforesaid and known and distinguished as lot number fifty one (51) containing One hundred and thirty acres be the same more or less - Excepting and always reserving therefrom Forty acres sold and conveyed to David Woodworth Ten acres sold and conveyed to Nicholas Rippon - two acres contracted to be sold to John Miller and also about three quarters of an acre designed and occupied for a burning ground
