To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas Conrad F. Shoup of Warren County New Jersey has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Detroit whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Conrad F. Shoup according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 2d^d of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the North East quarter of Section and the North East quarter of the North West quarter of Section Ten in Township Four, North, of Range Eleven, East, in the District of lands subject to at Detroit Michigan Territory, containing Two hundred acres, according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Conrad F. Shoup

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted; and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Conrad F. Shoup and to his heirs, the said tract above described:

To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Conrad F. Shoup and to his heirs and assigns forever.
