Whereas, Henry Stine, of Monroe County, Indiana
has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vincennes
whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Henry Stine
according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for
the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter of Section twenty, in Township
ten north, of Range two west, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Vincennes
Indiana, containing forty acres,
according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been pur-
chased by the said Henry Stine

NOW KNOW YE, That the **UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,** in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
several acts of Congress, in such cases made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said Henry Stine,
and to his heirs, the said tract above described:

To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said
Henry Stine,
and to his heirs and assigns forever.
