she came home all stoped up
with her cold and we had quite

a time with her. I kept on moving
on her to get her so she could
breathe so she did not go there
and there but she is as she is
going now.

So we did not go to church Sun.
it was so rainy

well I started in the week by
washing Papa started to plow
but quit about 10 o'clock on account
Floyd Lilly White could not get
any one to cut his corn he is down
there to day I am at Grand Ma now
I churned this morning I roned some
but did not finish have to eat
dinner with Grand Ma had every
thing good. I have ate as much
can hardly breathe we are young

up to mess Haveland's this
after noon.

No we have not filled our silos
and do not expect to for some
time if frosts hold off.

I have canned some tomatoes
and made a little catchup
well I will close and tell Louisa
finch lots of love Mamma
