

DEATH OF EDWIN C. HAYDEN ^R

The many friends of Edwin C. Hayden, a pioneer of Chesaning and well known throughout the county, were pained to learn of his death, Monday. He had been a resident of this vicinity the past 50 years. Mr. Hayden has been in ill health for several years and two months ago was confined to the bed and all hopes of recovery were despaired of. The funeral was held from the family home Wednesday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock, Rev. Fayette Haynes officiating and interment made in Wildwood.

Edwin C. Hayden was born ^{Aug.} 28th, 1842, near Grand Ledge, ^{East} Mich.

ham Co., Mich. Died Feb. 14th, 1916, at his residence one mile east of town.

At the age of five his parents moved to North Star, Gratiot Co., Mich., and his life was spent there until a young man. On Set. 1, 1863 he was united in marriage in the village of St. Johns, Mich., to Martha E. Baggs, of Mansfield, Ohio, with whom four children survive, Frank E. and J. Addison.
