

MRS CHAPMAN IS LAID TO REST

Former Resident But Had
Lived in Ann Arbor
For Many Years 1941.

Mrs. Helen A. Chapman, 91 years old and an Ann Arbor resident since 1900, died June 6, following a brief illness. Mrs. Chapman was the widow of William H. H. Chapman. She was born September 16, 1849 in Rose Center, Oakland county and was married December 23, 1875.

They lived in Chesaning for many years and in St. Johns for several years.

She was an active member of the Methodist church wherever she lived, a lifelong member of the Order of Eastern Stars and was active in local King's Daughters circles.

Mrs. Chapman was believed to be the oldest living member of the First Methodist church of Ann Arbor.

She is survived by a son, George H. Chapman, St. Johns; three daughters, Mrs. Frank B. Bauer, Adrian; Mrs. Charles C. Cook, Detroit, and Mrs. Warren H. Munger, Bentonville, Ind.; five grandchildren; 10 great grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services were held at 10:30 Monday morning at the First Methodist church and were conducted by Rev. Charles W. Brashares. The body was taken to Chesaning for burial.
