

FOR THIRTY YEARS

Wm. Mutchler, Sr., Lived on the Farm
on Which He Died.

Otterburn, Mich., Dec. 3.—William Mutchler, Sr., died at his home one mile south of the village shortly after last midnight, at the age of 75 years. He had been in poor health for the past two years from heart trouble and Bright's disease.

A resident of Michigan for the past forty years, Mr. Mutchler had lived on the farm in Flint on which he died for the past thirty years. He was born in New York state, and in 1859 was united in marriage to Miss Rosanna Shoup, who with eight children, survives. The children are: Charles S. Mutchler, of Flint; Mrs. M. Mills, of Detroit; Mrs. E. E. Sheldon and William A. Mutchler, of Mundy; Mrs. John Sherck and Mrs. Brittain White, of West Branch; Herman H. Mutchler, on the old homestead, and Miss Minerva Mutchler, at home.

The funeral will be held from the Bristol M. E. church at 11 o'clock Friday morning, Rev. Mr. Wallace, of Swartz Creek, officiating. Interment will be made at the Bristol cemetery.
