BODY LAID TO REST
IN MT. HOPE CEMETERY

Church in South Mundy Crowded by

bute to Young Man Killed by a Roll-

The funeral of Nathan Selden, the young man who was killed by a log in Mundy on Monday evening, was held yesterday afternoon from the South Mundy church. The church was filled with sorrowing relatives and friends, as the young man was held in high esteem by all who knew him, and there was a profusion of floral tributes. The funeral services were conducted by the pastor of the Methodist Episcopal church at Linden, and the remains were interred in Mt. Hope cemetery.

A peculiarly sad feature of the young man's death is that he was engaged to be married to an estimable young woman of Flint township, and the date for the wedding was yesterday, a day that witnessed the consignment of the young man's body to the tomb.
