Funeral of Mrs. Cook Held Here Monday

After a sickness of only two or three days Mrs. Adelbert O. Cook passed away suddenly, Saturday morning January 25, 1936 at the family home, 122 Summit Street, Howell, Mich. Mrs. Cook was taken sick Thursday so that the family doctor was called but the case was not considered serious as Mrs. Cook was about the house able to do some sewing, etc. Friday afternoon the doctor decided Mrs. Cook should remain in bed, but early Saturday morning she was taken worse and passed away before the doctor reached the home. The funeral service was held from the M. E. Church Monday afternoon at 1:30, Rev. George H. Curts, minister of the church, officiating with burial at Plainfield, Unadilla township, her girlhood home.

Ida E. Van Syckle, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. David Van Syckle, was born August 13, 1870, Plainfield, Unadilla township, Livingston county where she grew up to womanhood, attended the public schools, became a member of the Methodist Episcopal church. Her marriage with Moses Frazier occurred July 30, 1895. To this union four children were born. One died in infancy. Irene, Mrs. W. Matheny died in May 1929 Ira Frazier of Florida, and Marian, now Mrs. Alex Grigsby of Detroit. Mr. Frazier died while the three children were small.

Mrs. Cook was united in marriage with Adelbert O. Cook of Howell, May 28, 1922 and has lived at Howell since that time. She became a member of the M. E. Church and an active member of class No. 5 in the Sunday School and as president of the home missionary society. Besides the bereaved husband who is on the sick list Mrs. Cook leaves two brothers, Taft Van Syckle of Fenton and Bert Van Syckle of Battle Creek and one sister, Mrs. F. M. Spooner of Battle Creek, Mich., to mourn their loss. There are also two grandchildren, William and Margaret Matheny of Detroit and a large circle of friends.
